

Northern Wells Community Schools is seeking applicants for the position of Superintendent of Schools.

The successful candidate will begin official duties on July 1, 2020. During the first six months of employment, the candidate will hold the title of Associate Superintendent and work side-by-side with the retiring superintendent to create a successful transition. On January 1, 2021, the Associate Superintendent will begin his/her contract as Superintendent of Schools.

Application process:

Applications will be accepted through March 16, 2020. All applications must meet the State of Indiana requirements to be a Superintendent of Schools. Please visit www.nwcs.k12.in.us to complete the online application and upload any required materials.

Application screening:

The Board of Education will screen applications between March 17 and March 28.

Interview schedule:

First-round interviews will be held the week of April 6. Second round interviews will be held the week of April 13. Third round interviews will be conducted as necessary. The Board plans to conduct the contract hearing by May 12, 2020.
